

## The ArcelorMittal Orbit: Public Exhibition

On 31st March, the Mayor of London announced the design for a piece of public art that will be a permanent visitor attraction in the Olympic Park. The ArcelorMittal Orbit has been designed by the artist and sculptor Anish Kapoor, in collaboration with structural designer Cecil Balmond, of Arup, and is largely privately funded by the global steel company, ArcelorMittal.

A planning application for the ArcelorMittal Orbit will be submitted to the Olympic Delivery Authority Planning Decisions Team towards the end of May. Before the submission of the planning application for the ArcelorMittal Orbit, we would welcome comments on the proposal to build this visitor attraction in the Olympic Park.

An exhibition will be held where you can come and find out about the proposal including:

- Why the sculpture is proposed;
- How the design for the sculpture has developed and what it will look like; and
- What is the planning process and what happens next.
